Since my arrival at Tech, I've often shared that one of the most impactful decisions I made in my first year was purchasing a soft serve ice cream machine for the dining hall. While it may seem like a small gesture, it became a symbol of care and attention to student experience—so much so that I still hear about it every time the machine takes a break!

Another early and impactful decision was to add men's and women's cross country and track & field. At the time, it felt like a natural next step—but in hindsight, it has been truly transformational. 
and that energy consumption is expected to only increase as more and more of the world's six billion energy-poor residents gain access. Read more
