October is nationally recognized as Cybersecurity Awareness Month. Montana Tech's Information Technology team would like to take this opportunity to raise awareness about cybersecurity and its importance to our campus community.

Cyberattacks on academic institutions are on the rise. In March of this year, Inside Higher Ed warned that cybercriminals are increasingly targeting higher education institutions. In fact, attacks in 2021 have forced some institutions to shut down their campus as they resolved security issues and problems created by cybercriminals. This resulted in weeks of disruption for learners, teachers and researchers. Tech's IT Team recognizes that these attacks pose a significant risk to our institution.

Montana Tech IT will launch several campus initiatives to ensure our community has the resources needed to be safer and more secure online.

Phishing is one of the most successful forms of social engineering cybercriminals use to steal information. Testing our security, we recently conducted a cybersecurity phishing campaign and sent a campus wide "fake" phishing email.

The results were very concerning:

- Approximately 900 users clicked the link in the email.
- More than 300 users provided their logon credentials.

FALL PUBLIC LECTURE SERIES

Montana Tech's Public Lecture Series will host Alex Leone, Clark Fork Coalition, and Morgan Schultz, Montana Technological University, on Wednesday, October 13, 2021, at 4:00 p.m. (Mountain Standard Time –US). Their presentation is titled "Streambank Habitat Assessment Following River Restoration Along the Upper Clark Fork."

"As a watershed advocacy organization, landowner and water rights holder, the Clark Fork Coalition (CFC) has been deeply engaged in Superfund cleanup activities on the upper Clark Fork River for over a decade. As an advocacy organization, the CFC also often serves as a conduit for public grievances. With trout populations at all-time lows in the recently remediated reaches, many long-time recreationists are beginning to point fingers at the cleanup itself. As one Anaconda local put it, "the agencies are creating a fish desert in the upper Clark Fork". In response to the public's concerns, the CFC partnered with MT FWP and Montana Tech in 2020 & 2021 to investigate and quantify available fish habitats in both restored and unrestored reaches of the upper Clark Fork River. Floodplain remediation activities result in severe disturbances to riparian ecosystems and recovery of streamside vegetation, and other types of fish habitats (such as undercut banks) may take years or decades. To catalog and quantify those changes over time, the CFC is hoping data gleaned from the habitat assessment will be used to inform management decisions in the future. This talk will cover the lifecycle of an advocacy-driven research project, from its critique-driven inception to results and potential implications for management."

Alex Leone, Clark Fork Coalition, works as a stream restoration scientist and policy analyst for the Clark Fork Coalition based out of Anaconda. He works with public resource managers, landowners, universities, and the general public to design and implement restoration projects and studies that improve rivers and streams in western Montana. Alex attended both the University of Montana (B.S. in Forest Management) and Montana State University (M.S. in Earth Sciences).

Morgan Schultz, is from the Flathead Reservation, where he attained his BS in Hydrology from Salish Kootenai College in June 2020. He is currently a graduate student of the

Ecological Restoration Program at Montana Tech. His research experience is diverse, and he aims to give back to the freshwater ecosystems of Western Montana.
