TURNITIN TRAINING SESSION

Montana Technological University subscribes to Turnitin, text-matching identification software that can help instructors detect the presence of plagiarism in student papers. This powerful tool also simplifies remote assignment submission and has built-in electronic grading functions that significantly speed up the marking process. PUBLIC SERVICE LOAN FOREGIVENESS PROGRAM

As an employee of the Montana University System (MUS), you may qualify for the Public Service Loan Forgiveness (PSLF) Program. PSLF is a federal program that forgives the remaining balance on direct loans after 120 qualifying monthly payments under a qualifying repayment plan while an individual is working full-time for a qualifying employer. The MUS is a qualifying PSLF employer.

Last year, the U.S. Department of Education announced a time-limited waiver to allow borrowers to receive credit for past periods of repayment that would otherwise not qualify for loan forgiveness. Under the temporary waiver, any prior period of repayment counts as a qualifying payment, regardless of loan program, repayment plan, or whether the payment was made in full or on time, provided the employment requirements are satisfied.

Many in the MUS may have applied for PSLF and had their application rejected because they did not meet the PSLF criteria. The MUS encourages employees who may be eligible for relief under the program to apply or reapply, even if an application was previously submitted and rejected by the U.S. Department of Education.

The waiver is only available for a limited time. The deadline to submit the PSLF Application for the waiver is **October 31, 2022**. Individual employees are responsible for submitting all necessary forms to the U.S. Department of Education. Requests for employment certification should be directed to campus human resources.

To provide additional clarity for eligibility and to assist a broader range of employees, the MUS will consider a teaching load of 9 credits or more per semester to be "full-time" employment for the purpose of PSLF. This interpretation aligns with the U.S. Department of Education's recent proposal to overhaul the PSLF Program. The MUS's interpretation of full-time employment is only applicable to PSLF through the waiver period or until the U.S. Department of Education adopts the revised definition of "full-time" employment as proposed, whichever occurs earlier. This definition only applies to the PSLF Program. It does not apply to benefit eligibility determinations in the MUS or for purposes of the Affordable Care Act or to faculty workload analysis or assignments.
