CONSTITUTION DAY

Montana Tech will host an event in celebration of Constitution Day on **Friday, September 16, 2022 at 8:30 am** in the Honors lounge in Engineering Hall room 102. On September 17, 1787, the delegates to the Constitutional Convention met for the last time to sign the Constitution. In 2004, Congress enacted a law setting September 17 as the official federal observance of "Constitution Day and Citizenship Day," commonly known as Constitution Day. The act mandates that all publicly-funded educational institutions and all federal agencies provide educational programming on the Constitution. In 2005, the Department of Education announced that this law applies to any school receiving Federal funds of any kind. CENTER FOR ACADEMIC INNOVATION UPDATE

A quick note – we recently sent out the first edition of our monthly newsletter (SYNK – things you should know). If you did not receive it, please check your junk or spam folder. You CAN unsubscribe from the mailing with a link at the bottom of the document, but we do hope you'll give it a try. The purpose is to share new technologies and developments in teaching and learning and focus on the amazing accomplishments of our faculty, staff, and students. I hope

you will find it and mark it as “not junk” – I think it will be worth it!

The Center has established a regular professional development calendar for anyone who would like to learn more about some of the technologies on campus, best practices in teaching and learning, and even basic instructional design. Topics for September include Basic Panopto use, Moodle (Creating content and using the gradebook), Proctorio, engaging students (Wooclap and discussions), and best practices in course alignment. Although registration is not necessary, it is helpful for the facilitators to know who will attend. You can register using the Registration for CAI Training form. Please use the CAI calendar to see dates, locations, and brief descriptions of training sessions. (These will change monthly, so please check back.)

In addition, we are getting ready to launch our Innovation Committee. We are excited to foster true innovation by providing a hub for cross-institutional communication and collaboration. This is not intended to create more responsibility or work, rather it is to be a pathway to additional support and connection across campus. I truly hope you will consider being a part of this exciting group!

As a reminder–We ask those who use Zoom or Teams to stream your courses to try the Panopto tool we introduced last year. This is to help control costs with our video streaming and storage. It is a very user-friendly tool designed specifically for lecture capture. Among other features, it allows automatic captioning, searchable video, and direct placement into your Moodle course. In addition, there is not size limit on the cloud storage, so in about a month we will be changing the settings so that all Panopto recordings done in Zoom or Teams will automatically save in your online Panopto account, from which you can edit, post, share, or delete the file at your convenience.

We offer face-to-face basic training in this tool on September 27th ([register here](#)), or you can request a one-on-one session at your convenience. A recorded on-demand version will be available soon as well.
