LEGISLATIVE WEEK IN REVIEW: WEEK 1

The 69th Montana Legislature convened in Helena on **Monday, January 6** for its biennial 90-day session. Helena has been shrouded in dense fog for much of the week, as is the outcome of a Senate Rules debate, stalling committee work in that chamber. In addition, new bill and amendment drafting, tracking, and scheduling systems have contributed to the session's wobbly launch and have presented a few challenges for drafters, lawmakers, agencies, the media, and the public. <u>Read more</u>

DRIVER SAFETY TRAINING FOR CAMPUS

This is an online/self-paced course, offered by Risk Management and Tort Defense (RMTD), full of information on driving a large vehicle with occupants or gear for the university system. The course is designed to educate drivers on operating a wide variety of vehicles for MUS campuses. It expands coverage of defensive driving tips applicable to all motor vehicles while retaining information about the special techniques needed to safely drive the full-size sport utility vehicles and small buses still used by campuses. It also explains Board of Regents' driving policies and the stricter policies set by some campuses. Finally, it teaches what a driver should do if they are involved in a crash while driving on MUS business. The training is highly recommended if any MUS vehicle will be driven, and the training can be taken by any faculty, staff, or student of the university who can drive. Register for the training here.
