RESTORATION SEMINAR

You are invited to attend the first Restoration Seminar of the semester on Wednesday, January 22 from 4:00 pm to 5:00 pm in CBB 102 or via Zoom.

Montana Tech's Paul Helfrich will present Understanding the Impact of Tetracapsuloides bryosalmonae on Montana Trout Populations in a Changing Climate.

Abstract: Tetracapsuloides bryosalmonae is a myxozoan parasite of freshwater bryozoans and salmonid fish. Although in most circumstances infection by the parasite has only minimal infects on infected hosts, under stressful conditions, a deadly immune response to the parasite known as proliferative kidney disease (PKD) can develop in infected salmonid fish. The spread of PKD contributes to declines in wild trout populations in both the United States and Europe and is thought to be driven by the effects of climate change in these areas. Due to the pervasiveness, morbidity, and mortality associated with infection by parasite, T. bryosalmonae is a major threat to the long-term health of economically and ecologically important trout populations in Montana.


CAREER FAIR VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The Spring 2025 Career Fair is **Thursday, February 6th** starting at 8:00 am. DRIVER SAFETY TRAINING FOR CAMPUS

This is an online/self-paced course, offered by Risk Management and Tort Defense (RMTD), full of information on driving a large vehicle with occupants or gear for the university system. The course is designed to educate drivers on operating a wide variety of vehicles for MUS campuses. It expands coverage of defensive driving tips applicable to all motor vehicles while retaining information about the special techniques needed to safely drive the full-size sport utility vehicles and small buses still used by campuses. It also explains Board of Regents' driving policies and the stricter policies set by some campuses. Finally, it teaches what a driver should do if they are involved in a crash while driving on MUS business. The training is highly recommended if any MUS vehicle will be driven, and the training can be taken by any faculty, staff, or student of the university who can drive.
