PENETRATION TESTING - IMPORTANT SECURITY UPDATE

During the week of April 28, the Montana National Guard Cyber Team conducted penetration testing on our campus systems. One major vulnerability they identified was our tendency to be overly trusting when granting access to computers and network equipment.

To strengthen our security posture, please follow the updated IT security procedures outlined below—effective immediately:

New IT Security Procedure:

- Do not allow anyone access to your computer unless they are authorized IT personnel and you have received an official IT ticket in your inbox outlining the work to be performed.
- If there is no ticket, do not allow access—no exceptions.
- Many areas on campus are multi-purpose and contain both network infrastructure and other equipment. If you see someone interacting with network equipment, do not hesitate to question them:
 Who are you? What are you doing?
 If anything seems suspicious, immediately contact the IT Helpdesk at 406-496-4244. We appreciate your cooperation in keeping our systems and data secure. Further updates and training opportunities will be shared as needed.

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ONENOTE CLASS NOTEBOOK AUTOMATIC ROSTER SYNC RETIRING

Starting **April 23, 2025**, Microsoft will begin phasing out the automatic Canvas roster sync feature for OneNote Class Notebooks. This means new students will no longer be automatically added to Class Notebooks when they enroll in your Canvas course. Instructors will need to manually add students using the "Add or Remove Students" option in the Class Notebook tool within Canvas. Microsoft plans to share replacement options before August 2025. MEDIA SERVER BEING DECOMMISSIONED

Please be advised that Montana Tech I.T. is decommissioning the media server at media.mtech.edu. This will occur on **May 15, 2025**. If you have files on this server, please retrieve them prior to May 15, 2025. Moving forward we recommend the use of <u>Canvas</u>, <u>Teams</u>, Panopto, or <u>Onedrive</u> for storing and sharing your files. PASSWORD REQUIREMENTS HAVE CHANGED

Please be advised that the next time you change your password, you will be required to have a minimum of **15** characters.

Remember the following when you choose your new password:

- Cannot reuse previous passwords
- Cannot contain username or real name
- Must contain three of the four following categories:
 - Uppercase letters: A-ZLowercase letters: a-z
 - Numbers: 0-9

Special characters: !, @, ?, etc.

This change has been made because it is a cyber security best practice. Studies show it takes approximately 5 minutes for a hacker to crack an 8 character password (with our current requirements), and 77 million years to crack a 15 character password (with our current requirements).

2025 FISCAL YEAR-END PROCUREMENT INFORMATION

Fiscal Year End (June 30, 2025) is rapidly approaching. Your cooperation and timely processing of year-end purchases is important and appreciated in order to ensure that funds are spent in the appropriate fiscal year & that we have adequate time to process requests

No later than May 1, 2025: Submit requests for purchase orders for items less than \$10,000 to Erica Rude in Accounts Payable. Purchase Orders for next Fiscal Year (FY26) will not be issued until July 1, 2025

No later than June 13, 2025: Complete all Procard transactions for FY25 prior to June 13, 2025. June 14th-June 30th will be a purchasing blackout period (Procards cannot be used Unless you are in travel status)

You can start using your Procard for FY26 expenses on July 1, 2025

No later than June 13, 2025: Submit FY25 Invoices to Accounts Payable by June 13, 2025 @ Noon

Please understand that if the above deadlines are not met, we cannot guarantee that we will be able to process requests in this fiscal year, regardless of the source of funding (such as contract and grant funding). If you are planning a request to start or renew a contract or purchase in July or August, please adhere to the deadlines above to ensure timely processing of such requests.
