MULTI-FACTOR AUTHENTICATION

In order to bring multi-factor authentication to all users in the most cost effective manner, Montana Tech will be transitioning from Shibboleth/DUO to Microsoft Authentication. Both systems, use the same backend so your password will carry with you throughout the process. This project is being done in phases, with this being the 'TRANSITIONAL' phase. DRIVER'S SAFETY TRAINING FOR CAMPUS

This online/self-paced course, offered by Risk Management and Tort Defense (RMTD), is full of information on driving a large vehicle with occupants or gear for the university system. The course is designed to educate drivers on operating a wide variety of vehicles for MUS campuses. It expands coverage of defensive driving tips applicable to all motor vehicles while retaining information about the special techniques needed to safely drive the full-size sport utility vehicles and

small buses still used by campuses. It also explains Board of Regents' driving policies and the stricter policies set by some campuses. Finally, it teaches what a driver should do if they are involved in a crash while driving on MUS business. The training is highly recommended if any MUS vehicle will be driven, and the training can be taken by any faculty, staff, or student of the university who can drive. Register [here](#).
