NURSING AT MONTANA TECH

Enter the exciting world of health care: become a registered nurse at Montana Tech! Our Nursing program fosters a holistic approach. It is one that takes into consideration the physical, psychological, spiritual and sociocultural needs of the individual, family and community. Montana Tech's nursing faculty teach with the guiding philosophy that the nursing profession is best served through highly educated members who continually strive to broaden their knowledge and expertise to meet the increasing needs of the health care environment. It's one of the reasons why Montana Tech's Nursing Program is known for being the most rigorous in the state.

After acceptance to Montana Tech, students are placed in pre-nursing, and submit a second application for acceptance into the nursing program. After acceptance into the program, the final five semesters focus on baccalaureate level nursing theory and clinical practice. 73 credits of nursing courses prepare students for entry into nursing practice in a range of health care settings with populations that cover the life span. A total of 945 hours of clinical practice is included in the curriculum. Graduates will be eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN®), as well as be prepared for entry to graduate nursing programs at other institutions.

WHAT CAN YOU DO WITH YOUR DEGREE?

The nursing profession is the nation's largest health care profession, with more than 3.1 million registered nurses nationwide. Registered nurses make up one of the largest segments of the workforce in the U.S. and are among the highest paying profession in healthcare. Graduates of Montana Tech's Nursing Program pursue careers in hospitals and clinical settings across the country, and often go on to complete their Master of Science in Nursing.
