




Sage-grouse Lek Counts (AHM Leks) 1980 - 2015

SAGE GROUSE TIMELINE



- 1965-2005: Population declines throughout the west
- 2005: FWP Management Plan
- 2005: USFWS: "listing not warranted"
- 2010: USFWS: "listing warranted but precluded"
- 2010-2011: USFWS sued
 - o settlement agreement
 - o decide by September 30, 2015

Lack of Regulatory Mechanisms to Address Threats

- 2013: MT Advisory Council
- 2014: Executive Order 10-2014
- 2015: Montana Conservation Strategy
 - o Executive Order 12-2015
 - Montana Legislature
 - Sage Grouse Stewardship Act
- 2015: USFWS ESA
 - o "listing not warranted"
 - o state commitments
 - follow through critical to future decisions about whether to list
 - o status review in five years


Montana's Conservation Strategy

1. Executive Order 12-2015

- Mirrors Wyoming
- Establishes State Program
- Establishes Oversight Team (MSGOT)
- Designates key habitat areas
 - "core areas" strategy
- Consultation state programs
 - permitted activities
 - grant programs
 - technical assistance
 - guide activities in designated habitats to achieve goal
 - o consult, not regulate
 - o mitigation: avoid, minimize, reclaim, replace or compensate





Core Areas Strategy: Focus on Designated Habitats







- 3. Compare to Executive Order thresholds and stipulations




Core Areas Only Additional Program Review: Density Disturbance Calculation Tool

2. Greater Sage Grouse Stewardship Act (2015)

- Stewardship Fund Grant Program
 - Fund conservation benefits to sage grouse & habitat
 - Create credits to sell to developers as offsets to impacts in a marketplace
 - Oversight Team decides

Mitigation Framework

- address impacts of habitat loss using a marketplace
- avoid, minimize, restore, replace or compensate
- Conservation Bank (or)

- Oversight Team approves


